This work represents an effort to put into usable form data concertaing Nance marriages before 1850c

The material has been copied from the official court records of Virginia and North Carolina. I have had little opportunity to obtain data from other states. However, some persons have been kind enough to send in information, and this has been included.

Records have been copied exactly as they appear in the official sources. It should be remembered, nevertheless, that in many cases the handwriting is very difficult to read, and often one can do little more than guess at the spelling intended. In every case it is wise to check with the source, if possible, as errors in transcribing can easily happen.

The arrangement of items is alphabetical. In each case the name of the Nance principal is given, with the name of the spouse opposite. In case of several similar names, then they are arranged chronologically.

Comments and additional information are given in note form below the line. In every case the source has been given. Only a few statements based on "tradition" are included. Whenever the parents are known they are given in the same note fashion.

Considerable use has been made of the Nance Memorial and The History and Genealogy of the Nances, as these books are rare and difficult to consult. This does not mean, however, that I consider all these quotations accurate. Frequently there are very obvious contradictions and improbabilities, but the statement is given anyway so that the reader can draw his own conclusions.

As marriage records were not kept until the 1780°s, it has been necessary to use wills and deeds as sources of information. Often the marriage bonds of a county have been carelessly kept, and today many are missing, even for comparatively late years. These gaps can be only partially filled from other sources.

The date which appears on the bond is the date it was issued. Usually the marriage was not perfomed until a day or two, even, weeks. later.

This meterial has been provided with an index which is intended to be complete, with the exception of place names. I have spent many an hour searching material, only to find that there was nothing in it that I wanted.

In the index each name is given exactly as it appears, even though it is obvious that it is a variant of another more common spelling. Thus you will find Reubin and Reuben, Louis and Lewes, Snyder and Snider. Always check for variants. They are not always

obvious, as Palmore and Palmer.

In this index the Nance wife is listed by her maiden name - of course, she could be a widow -, and also under the Nance haeding by her first name. Thus you will find Mary Jones listed as Jones, Mary, and also as Nance, Mary (Jones). This has been done in an effort to simplify searching.

Remember to look for principals by nicknames as well as by the true name. Thus a Mary will often appear as Molly or Polly; Martha as Patsy or Patty; Serah as Sally; and Margaret as Peggy.

The marriages listed here are, of course, far from complete. By further search and with your assistance I hope to be able to add to it, and to prepare a much enlarged and better work.

This work is not intended to be a genealogy, but only a reference book which will provide clues for further search. It should be used in connection with the other material I have compiled, the Nance Wills and Pensions.

I should appreciate very much any additional data you may be able to send, and any help in further identifying the individuals who are as yet not known. By putting together all available information it may be possible to produce an authentic Nance genealogy back to our original immigrant ancestor.

Finally, my sincere thanks to the many persons who have sent in data to be used in this compilation.

There were several intermarriages of the Nances with the Allen family in Mecklenburg and Brunswick counties, Vac HGN, page 126-127, gives some data on this Allen family.

This Allen was the son of Reuben and Amy (Williamson) Nance, Born 18 jan 1776, probably in Mecklenburg. He did not stay in Henry county, but it is not known where he went.

"Benjamin Estes Nance was born in Bedford County, Virginia, 17 1 feb 1830. Son of John and Martha (Estes) Nance. Grandson of Richard Nance, who was a soldier in the Revolution. His father John was a soldier in the war of 1812. Went to Howard county, Missouri, in 1855. Owned a 1427 acre farm. Married 24 dec 1847 Elizabeth R. Tinsley, Issue: two children: Laura, md.

P. H. Burton, Martha E, md., Thomas Jordan." History of Howard and Cooper Counties, Missouri, p. 522

Note: date given for marriage does not agree with bond date.

I have found no evidence that Richard Mance was a Revolutionary soldier. Also, there is no John Nance included in the Index of Soldiers of the War of 1812. Of course, it may not be complete.

NM, page 314, has several paragraphs about Benjamin Nance. Essentially the same as given above. He says that there were seven children, but only two lived to adulthood.

Bird is the son of Reuben and Amy (Williamson) Nance, he was born 24 jly 1772. He remained in Henry county until 1798 or 1797

"Bird, or Captain Bird, an old gentleman, died in Richmond, Mo... aged about ninety. He was too old to write or to remember much distinctly, when the author first learned of him. Jefferson Amzi Nance of Excelsior Springs, Missouri, used to visit him, and they claimed kinship, but could not be certain. Now it is certain, Captain Bird said there were twenty-one boys and seven girls in the twenty-eight."

The NM is devoted largely to this man and his descendants. As this book is available in most of the larger libraries, we shall list only the names of his immediate children; they were: Dorothy; Mosias; Susan; Mary; William; Nancy May; Clement; Jane; John Wesley; Elizabeth; James Reed; Giles.

All of his children were born in Virginia, and some of them were married there. He, with most of his family, left Virginia in 1803, going first to Kentucky, where he remained some 18 months, and then pressing on into the Indiana Territory, where he made his home.

NM, p. 22, states that Clement died in late July or August, 1828, at the age of 72. Born, then, in 1756. NM, p. 13: "Clement Nance and Mary Jones were probably married in 1775. Their first child was born March 22, 1776."

The author of the NM, after much speculation, could arrive at no satisfactory conclusion as to the father of Clement. See under David - Mary Crenshaw for more as to his ideas.

It seems to me that he is the son of Giles Nance, whose will is recorded in wake, N C₀ 1809 (probated 1811) q.v. By this will Clement Nance, brother of William Malone Nance, received 300 acres of land on Sugar Creek, in Pittsylvania county. On July 10, 1813, Clement Nance of Harrison county, Indiana, sells 383 acres of land to Reuben Curtis... with pointers in William M Nance's line, (Bk 25, p. 599)

There is one puzzle about this however. On 1 feb 1812, Clement Nance of Newberry S C, sells 100 acres of land in Pittsylvenia, on both sides of Little Sugar Tree Creek, and the deed is witnessed by William M Nance. If this is the son of Giles, what did he do with the other 200 acres? And what is the relationship of the two?

I believe that the Clement of Indiana is Giles' song, however.
A study of the names of the children in the two families seems to indicate that this is true.

The Clement of Newberry S C mentioned above. He was a brother of Frederick Nance of Newberry. See under Frederick, and see Clement's, Frederick's, and Erasmus G Nance's wills.

NM, p 286, says: "David Nanc ewas a soldier in the Revolution under Washington. He remained two years, when, after the severe winter at Valley Forge, his health was so impaired as to be unfit for service, his nephew Zachariah Nance II voluntarily took his uncle's place and served until the close of the war. When David went home to repair his health, he was murdered, and left his children orphons. They were bound out at the end of the war. His brothers and sisters, so far as known, were Zachariah I, William Howe, Frederick, and Patsey Sneed. His sons, so far as known, are Frederick, kobert. Giles, Clement, Erasmus, and William Howe."

NB: All of this is incorrect, or at the best, quite confused.

These persons are doubtless close relatives, but, for most of them, the relationship cannot be determined exactly with the insufficient data I have now.

William Crenshaw in his will, q. v. mentions his daughter Mary as the wife of David Nance, and he leaves gifts to his grandchildre David, William, Mary, Elizabeth, and Susanna Nance.

In 1796 Giles Nance deeds land, "for love and affection" to William and David, sons of David Nance, desd. Giles, however, was not their grandfather, as he was born in 1735, and David married 1769. Giles may have been David's brother, and their parents John and Martha Nance.

Fontaine is a family name, and there were numerous Fontaines in Virginia and in Henry County. I have not yet been able to discover the connection.

The 1870 census for Henry County gives Fontaine Nance, age 48; Gemina, 44; tuoisana, 22; Addison F, 20; France J, 17; Mary F, 11; Archibald, 8; Adair A, 2. All listed as born in Virginia, except Mary F, born in Illinois.

"Jemina Nance died hidgeway Township, Henry County, 1870, age 44, of typhoid. Parents unknown. Wife of Fontaine Nance."

Giles is the son of John and Martha Nance, born 4 may 1735.

(Bristol Parish Register)

He lived in Amelia (later Nottoway) county until 1802, when he moved to Wake county, North Carolina, buying land near Raleigh.

He secured in 1779 a grant to 1574 acres of land on Cascade Creek in Pittsylvamia, but apparently did not live there, as his name does not appear on the personal property lists of that county at any time.

Pittsylvania records show numerous deeds by him to various Nances and others. There grew up quite a large "Nance" settlement, with families so numerous, so closely related, and with the same Christian names that it is almost impossible to determine their true relationship. Pittslyvania is adjacent to Henry county, Virginia, and to Rockingham, North Carolina, Although many families left this region, there are still many descendants living here. As is the case with most persons, they know nothing of their family history, The usual statement is that and an indefinite number (from 3 to 14) brothers came over "from England and started the Nance family," The "14" doubtless is based on Reuben Nance's sons, He had 14 in his family,

See Giles' will for the names of his children. Some remained in Virginia, others went to other sections, and some went with him to Wake.

"Giles Nance died a few days ago in Wake county near Falls of the Neuse.. age in his 74th year." Notice in the Raleigh State Register 10 sep 1810.

The son of Giles and Mary Nance. Probably the youngest child. He went with his father to wake, and then to Huntsville, Alabama, where he died. His will is recorded there, 1852.

Hardin Nance lived on the North Carolina- Virginia line, in Rockingham N C, and Henry, Va. It is not known who his parents wre, except that his mother was Mollie B Nance. He had at least one brother, Clement, who lived in Rockingham N C. Another borther may have been Pleasant Nance, who had a son named Hardin. Undoubtedly the name Hardin came from some near relative, but the connection has not been found.

Hardin Nance was a farmer, and owned lend in Henry county. There is a family cemetery locted on this land, which is located a few miles east of Ridgeway, Va. He is buried beside his wife, with several other members of the family. The inscription on his tombstone reads:

It is interesting to speculate as to the parents of this man, He could be a son of the Richard of 1839, for if he were born between 1640 and 1650, he would have been between 76 and 66 at the time of his death, not at all an improbable age. We can deduce from studying his will that he had several married children who must have been at least between thirty and forty, which means that they were born between 1375 and 1685. The William mentioned in the 17th century records could have been his brother - or his father.

Probably the son of John and Sarah of the above note. The Bristol Parish Register gives his children as: Elinor, born 25 may 1721; Thomas, b. 22 sep 1723; Richard, b. 24 jan 1726; William, b. 12 jly 1728.

John Nance probably died in Pittsylvania county in 1762, as shown by this record in the Court Orders: "Martha Nance, widow and relict of John Nance, deceased, is granted the adminstration of his estate," April court, 1762,

Martha Nance's name appears of the Pittsylvania personal proterty tax lists for the years 1783 and 1784, and shows that she owned one slave and one house. She must have died in 1784, as her name does not appear after that. Clement and William Malone Nance appear together with hers. They were the sons of Giles, and therefore her grandsons.

I am not certain that there was a marriage here. In the Amelia Deeds, Bk, 1, page 7, Latthew Smart of Norchant Brandon, of Prince George County, sells to John Nance of kaleigh Parish of Amelia, for one shilling, 300 acres of land in Amelia between the branches of Little Nottoway kiver. This must have been a gift of land for marrying a daughter.

He was a Primitive Baptist preacher. There is supposed to be a short biography of him in a <u>History of Kentucky Baptists</u>, but I do not have exact title,

NM, page 304, 309, says: "Peyton Skipper Nance married his first cousin, Miss Eleanor Nance Simms... she is said to have had two sisters who married two brothers of Peyton Skipper Nance..."

Henry County <u>Deeds</u>, Bk 10, 129 (1825) shows his signature as Peyton S Nance, and his wife's as Nelly N Nance. Ellinor Jennings may have been a widow.

Peyton's brother Edmund married Anna Simms 27 may 1829, with the same Lewis Foster as security. I have found no record of another Nance-Simms marriage.

Jane Nance md Ignatious Simms 1790. She may have been the daughter of John Nance, brother of Reuben Nance, who was in this region at that time. Ellinor Jennings and Anna Simms may have been her daughters.

HGN, page 58 "Quintina was the fifth daughter of Wyatt and Polly (Cook) Nance, married John Edwards, brother of Allen Edwards, and the son of Jacky Edwards. They had one daughter, Elizabeth, who married John Stafford."

I believe this man is the progenitor of the Nance family, at least of all the Virginia Nances = and I have found none any where else at an early date. As the early records of our key counties are lost, there is very little data available, so we can only speculate. I believe him the father of the William mentioned in the 17th century records, probably father of the John whose will is filed 1716. There may have been other children also. It is interesting to note that the name of his wife, Alice, is not found in any of the Nance families. This may mean that she died, and that hichard married a second time, perhaps an Eleanor or Elizabeth, as these are noth very popular in all families.

Richard was born ca. 1700. He died in Bedford county, ca. 1780, for on 25 mar 1780 he deed to Thomas Nance, "for natural love and affection, and for 2 500, 8 slaves and all personal property." Deed Book 6, 407.

Brunswick county, Va., 1770. His mother's name is not known, but, as Reuben named two of his children Sally - the first daughters by each of his two wives - I would guess that her name was Sarah _______.

Reuben was born ca. 1745, probably in what is now the Brunswick. Mecklenburg district. His father lived in Brunswick, but we find the first records of keucen and his brothers John, and Isham in Mecklenburg, which edjoins Brunswick. He died in Henry county 13 jan 1812.

Reuben's first wife was Amy Williamson, whom he married ca. 1766, as their first child was born 14 jly 1767. The NM gibes her name as Williams, but other records show it as Williamson. There was a close connection between the Nance and the Williamson families in this section. I have searched the records here, but have been unable so fer to locate her parents.

After the death of his father, Reuben sold his lands in Mecklenburg in late 1771, and moved up into Henry county, which was then being opened up for settlement. He obtained some land by state grants, and purchased other acreage from various individuals, until he had more than 440 acres. He lived in the eastern section of the county, near the Pittsylvania-Henry line, at a place called Leatherwood. A mountian here is still called Nance's mountain.

Reuben was a man of some education, as he was appointed a surveyor for a time. He also served several months in the Revolution as an ensign, but soon resigned. He is supposed to have had Patrick Henry for a neighbor.

Fortunately his Bible record has been saved, and so we now know the names of his children. The Nance Memorial makes the statement that he was the father of twenty-eight children, and this, although false, has been spread as truth. He actually had only twenty, fourteen sons and six daughters. All of them, apparently, married, and all left Henry county to go to the west and the south, where new land was cheap and easy to obtain. Several were Primitive Baptist ministers.

Reuben was accompanied into the Henry county section by his brother John, but unfortunately no concise record has been found of his family. His brother Isham remained in Mecklemburg, and the record of the division of his estate tells us who his children were.

He was twice married, the first five children were by his first wife, and Sarah and Lucy were by the second marriage. His first wife was supposed to be a sister of James Marshall, and last wife Faithy Merriman."

Part of this statement is incorrect. Robert is the son of the Daniel Mance who died 1780 in Randolph N C. NM, page 329, says: "Robert Mance... had three nephews, Hudson, Thomas, and Marshall, who settled in Randolph county, N C, about 1795." A comparison of the wills of Daniel and his son Thomas (1808) shows that this is correct.

(There's a confusion of names in this will. It begins: I, Thomas Walker... but is signed James x Walker. writing clear... Someone erred.) Lunenburg, 18 oct 1802.

Robert is the son of Clement Nance, whose will is in Newberry, South Carolina. (Made 1828; probated 1844). Summer, History of Newberry, gives this tombstone inscription: "Robert Nance, native of Virginia, b. 10 Jan 1776, d 17 nov 1822." This Clement is the one that is supposed to have married Frances Eppes, q.v. However, Summer also gives inscrition of Erasmus G Nance, brother of Robert: "Erasmus G Nance, son of Clement and Elizabeth S Nance, b 8 jan, 1814; d 8 jan 1855" and also "Elizabeth S Nance, b. 11 Mar 1784, d. 4 apr 1835" She was probably Clement's 2nd wife, for she certainly could not have been Robert's mother.
