BERT NETTLES

The death of Bert Nettles means a personal loss to many people who were associated with him in newspaper work in Shreveport during the past 46 years, From 1953 when The Shreveport Journal and The Shreveport Times formed the Newspaper Production Co.., until 1964 when he retired, Mr. Nettles was the beloved superintendent of the composing room of these papers, For the last six years of his career he also held the position of assistant production superintendent,

His ability and his personal qualities were widely recognized. The Southern Newspaper Publishers Association honored him by electing him to several offices. He was a member of the executive committee of the Southern Newspaper Mechanical Conference. His membership in the typographical union extended over almost a half-century.

Mr. Nettles was born and educated Alabama, In typical Southern fashion, he enjoyed good company and he was fond of fishing and hunting. After his retirement he spent much of his time at his camp on Lake Bistineau.

He was firm yet eminently fair in all matters concerning the composing room. Never did he criticize anyone's work in public; when he had to reprimand somebody he did it privately and in a gentlemanly manner, showing that he respected the other person,

Invariably when contributions were taken for some worthy cause he was one of the first if not the very first in his department to donate, and customarily he gave the largest amount, Needy cases immediately touched his heart, and he let them have money or looked for jobs for them.
