I believe, but cannot prove, that Pleasant was a brother of Harden Nance, q.v. The two lived very close to each other, and Pleasant named one son Harden. My guess as to Pleasant's father would be John, as he named one son John Allen Nance, the John for his own father and the Allen for his wife's father, Allen Barker. Then Pleasant's son Elkanah, named a child John Pleasant, which could be for his grandfather and father.

This young man has, for the past four years, been seeking identity of the parents of Henderson Nance (his oldest known ancestor), bn. Cumberland Co., Ky., 1808. (See Cumberland Co. records) died 18 Oct.1859, buried Metcalf Co., Ky. near Cumberland County line.

The writer has been most interested in helping this young man and has recently discovered a Knox Co., Tenn. will of Thomas Nance, probated 1822. It is my belief that this Thomas is the son of Richard and Mary Nance of Bedford Co., Va. According to NM, Thomas did move to Knox Co., Tenn. in his old age and married 2nd Mary Cooper. The author of NM admits there is some confusion as to names of children from each of the two wives, but there are some names used in NM common to some of the names in said will.
