THE MCKINNIE FAMILY

Gen. I - Michael Macquinney in his will, which was witnessed by Jeremiah Ilium left property to son John, wife Elizabeth and "young son Barnaby". His will is dated April 15 1686, and is recorded in Isle of Wight Co., Va., in Deed Bk 2 p 264. Wm. and Mary Quart, Ser 1 Vol 27 has an article on "Three Early Landowners of Isle of Wight County Virginia: the three being Jeremiah Exum, Michael Mackquinney, William Pope.

Some authorities give the father of Michael as "Sir Barnaby McKinney" one of the Lords of the Isles. The name is spelled Mackinney, Mackinning, Machinven, Mackquinney. Later it is spelled Mckinne, Mackinney, McKinnie. The historical spelling is usually McKinnie. It is said the McKinnes were of the Clan McKinnon which means "Beloved Son" (see the Clans, Sects and Regiments of the Scottish Highlanders, by Frank Adams).

Gen. II - Barnabas McKinne (b. c1673 - d.1740, Edgecombe Co., N.C.), md. let Mary ?, 2nd md. Mary "Exum" Ricks Murphy after 1716. He was her third husband, she being twice widowed and the daughter of Judge Jeremiah Exum.

There have been many lineages published concerning descendants of Col. Barnaby McKinnie that have the Exum-Lawrence lines in their lineages. The following records indicate that Col. Barnaby McKinnie was married twice, 1st to Mary ?, 2nd to Mary "Exum" Ricks Murphy, widow of Jacob Ricks and of William Murphy Jr.

1. Isle of Wight deed Bk. I, p.341 - Barnaby McKinnie and wife Mary sign deed 9 Dec.1701.
2. Quaker Records - Jacob Ricks living in 1703, 6 Mar. Jacob Ricks died 5 May 1703/04.
3. Deed Bk. A, p.594 - Rec. 28 Apr.1716. Appraisal of estate of William Murphy Jr., signed by Mary Murphy. Couldn't have married Barnaby McKinnie.
4. Account of settlement of estate of William Murphy Jr. 22 Feb. 1719/20. Signed by Barnaby McKinnie and wife, Mary McKinnie administrators. (English law automatically made a new husband co-administrator.
5. Isle of Wight Bk. p.19, Will of Ann Exum (widow of Jeremiah). To daughters Elizabeth Exum, Mary McKinnie, Jane Outland, Mourning Scott, Christian Nosworthy. Grand-children: 1. Ann Murphy, 2. Jeremiah Lawrence, 3. Exum Scott, 4. Richard Exum Outland. The ages of Col, Barnaby's children indicate that most if not all of these children were of the first marriage.

Barnaby McKinnie's Will is dated 1737 (Colonial Records of NC, Vol. V 25, p.975.) He petitioned Va. Assembly in 1702 for permission to build a grist mill in I.ofW. Co., later Southampton Co. Afterward moved to Edgecombe Co., N.C.
