Treasury Warrant No. 340, 29 March 1780, Land in Fayette County (then Virginia) on Mill Creek and North Fork of Sickling Creek. Signed by Beverly Randolph, Lt. Gov. of Virginia, 15 January 1785. The 1790 census lists Harwood Nana.
